INTRO TO FUSED & SLUMPED GLASS

This class covers all the basic information about slumping and fusing glass. Slumping is a relatively new method of artistic glass making. It involves the controlled heating of glass in a kiln which allows gravity to gently shape it in a ceramic mold. Fusing is another method of kiln formed glass. The temperature in the kiln is brought high enough to permanently bond pieces of glass together. Students will learn to cut glass, assemble projects and the basic principles of heating and cooling glass. No previous experience necessary. \$25 materials fee payable to the instructor. 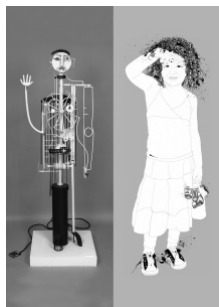
